
The Palestinian Central Bureau of Statistics and Ministry of Health, with technical and financial support from UNICEF and UNFPA, carried out the fifth round of the Palestinian Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (PMICS).

PMICS is part of the global MICS programme. It aims at providing data on progress towards the established goals in the Millennium Declaration and contributing to the improvement of data and monitoring systems in the State of Palestine. Carried out between March and April 2014, the survey covered more than 11,000 households across the country, including East Jerusalem. This booklet provides preliminary data and results of key indicators, reflecting the situation of children and women.

For every 1,000 chidren born alive, 18 (close to 2%) are dying before reaching their first birthday.














## **UNDER FIVE MORTALITY RATE (U5MR)\***



For every 1,000 children born alive, 22 (more than to 2%) are dying between birth and the fifth birthday.










Probability of dying between birth and the fifth birthday, expressed per 1,000 live births.




#### **STUNTING PREVALENCE\***






















It is worth noting that water sourced from a tanker-truck is classified as an unimproved drinking water source, which is the main source of drinking water in the Gaza Strip (68%). Tanker trucks can become very contaminated if they are not cleaned regularly and filled with properly chlorinated water for drinking (WHO Fact Sheet 2.28)

Improved sanitation facilities include: Flush to piped sewer system; flush to cesspit; and flush to pit, but not shared.













Percentage of children attending first grade of basic education who attended preschool education programmes in the previous year of the survey.


## **BASIC SCHOOL NET ATTENDANCE RATIO\***













Percentage of children of basic school age who are currently attending basic or secondary education.


## **SECONDARY SCHOOL NET ATTENDANCE RATIO\***



#### CHILD DEVELOPMENT INDEX




72% of children age 36-59 months are developmentally on track in at least three of the four domains: literacy-numeracy, physical, social-emotional, and learning.

## **Children are developmentally on track if:**

# Domains

#### Literacy-numeracy 22%

At least two of these are true: the child can identify/name at least ten letters of the alphabets, whether he/she can read at least four simple popular words, and whether he/she know the name and recognize the symbols of all numbers from 1 to 10.

#### Physical 96%

The child can pick up a small object with two fingers, such as a stick or a rock from the ground, and/or the mother/ caretaker does not indicate that the child is sometimes too sick to play.

#### Social-Emotional 71%

At least two of the following are true: the child gets along well with other children: the child does not kick, bite, or hit other children; and the child does not get distracted easily.

#### Learning 92%

The child follows simple directions on how to do something correctly, and/ or when given something to do, and is able to do it independently.
